

CV ARCH. FABIAN LLISTERRI

Architect for the School of Architecture of Barcelona (Spain).

From 1982 until 2003 works in his own firm in the fields of construction, planning and advisory services to investment funds in the property sector in the United States.

In 2003 starts his institutional work as elected president of his regional professional organization, the "Colegio Oficial de Arquitectos de la Comunidad Valenciana" (COACV).

In that date (2003) he become member of the Spanish Council's (CSCAE) Board of Directors and was appointed as coordinator of the Council's International Department.

He represented the Spanish Architects in the UIA (International Union of Architects), the ACE (Architects Council of Europe) and the UMAR (Union of Mediterranean Architects).

In the ACE, he had an active role in the Commission in charge of reviewing the Statutes that finally produced substantial changes in the organization, and in 2005 was elected member of the first Executive Board under the new norms, for a two-year period.

In the UIA, he became responsible of the Continuing Professional Development Programme since its inception in 2005 together with the AIA (American Institute of Architects). Once this organization left the programme in 2006 he became coordinator of the GPO (General Programme Operator Company). He contributed to the full development of this program until its dissolution in 2015. Along that period, he achieved the approval by the UIA Council of the quality guidelines, the CPD registry, the Mutual CPD accords, the International Credit as well as the UIA CPD Quality Label, the working and complaining procedures and the creation of the respective websites.

In 2008, he was elected as UIA Council member for Region I and as such, he participated in the UIA Region I coordination meetings and in the Vision and Strategy Committee.

In his capacity of UIA Council member he has also coordinated the CPD Programme JOC (Joint Oversight Committee) and was a member of the UIA CPD Systems Review Committee.

As a pilot experience, he promoted the formation of a joint working group UIA/ACE to create a European space for CPD. This group is already in place and the ACE General Assembly approved the equivalent of the UIA CPD Programme as the ACE CPD Programme which is in force and working today. He also took part of the Task Force created between the ACE and the UIA Region I to improve the collaboration between both institutions.

In 2009, he was elected Secretary General of the UMAR (Union of the Mediterranean Architects) carrying out the General Secretariat responsibilities in the Union.

He developed several projects under EU Programs controlled by the EU Commission. The last one, MARIE was approved with a budget of over 6 Million Euros. The UMAR participated in the project as full partner and Mr. Llisterra worked as Project Manager responsible of the Communication and Training Plan. The general objectives of this project were the reconversion of the existing building stock in the Mediterranean regions as Energy Efficient.

In 2014 he was elected UIA Treasurer for the triennial period 2014-2017. In that post he was involved in the main changes carried out by the Union, a revision of the Section's fees, the proposal of a change of cycle between Congresses, the proposal to UNESCO of the

nomination of the elected cities to host the UIA Congresses as World Capital of Architecture approved by the UNESCO Board in October 2017, etc.

He has overseen the presentation to the General Assembly of the new contents of the UIA Articles & Bylaws including the above-mentioned changes, for approval.

In 2017, he was renewed in his post as UIA Treasurer for the period 2017-2020.

Through the past years, he has developed a network of international contacts that may be of interest for the UIA as well as for the rest of international organizations.
